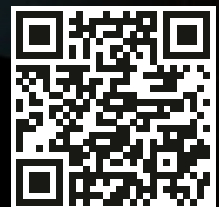

What is Lutherbound?

You would like to display our downloadable exhibition #HereIStand – Martin Luther, the Reformation and its Results in a way that is both fun and educating? Or you would like to include the exhibition in your lessons? Well, our Lutherbound app offers an easy way to do just that!

Actionbound

Our **Lutherbound** is a digital puzzlehunt which takes about 40 minutes to complete and can be played on a smartphone or tablet. It was developed on the basis of the free app **Actionbound**. You can read more about this app here: www.actionbound.com

What do you need?



Poster Package M



Smartphone/Tablet



Internet Access

A copy of our poster exhibition #HereIStand in size M or larger (www.here-i-stand.com/de/order#poster-packages). You can download them individually for free and print them out yourself. For further information see www.here-i-stand.com.

Smartphones or tablets on which the **Actionbound** app has been installed. The Lutherbound can be played by individuals as well as competing teams.

A connection to the internet which allows you to download the content of the quiz. Please note: the download might cause additional costs by your provider.

How does it work?

The quiz is activated by scanning the QR-code overleaf with the Actionbound app. As the players follow the **Lutherbound**, they can score points by answering questions correctly. The maximum possible score is 300 points. At the end of the puzzlehunt, you will find the score displayed on each participant's device.

Some useful advice

If you print out the overleaf page you can display it next to your poster exhibition. This way people get to know about **Lutherbound**.

You do not have to display the separate posters next to each other – if you spread them out over a building or an area, it will make the quiz more challenging and dynamic. In this case, your pupils will have to hunt down the posters before they can tackle the questions.

We recommend downloading the complete data set before the participants start so that you will not need an internet connection later. Please note: the download might cause additional costs by your provider.

For reasons of data security, we advise that participants use nicknames or first names, not their full names.

Most of the answers concerning a particular section can be found on the poster named at the beginning of the section. The posters themselves display their number in the upper right hand corner. Some answers, however, need to be deducted indirectly – especially questions where you have to make an educated guess.

Make sure that the participants keep the last page of their **Lutherbound** open in the end to allow you to compare and evaluate the scores.
